I own a Junior Hymnal for Sunday School, first printed in 1928. It's an interesting hymnal. In the back there is an Order of Service based on the regular service that we share. It does note that, by and large, it should really only be used on days other than Sundays, that "for actual worship the school should unite with the congregation for its Regular Sunday morning worship". Nonetheless, it is an interesting glimpse into how Sunday School was run when it was in transition from "school for poor children" into "theological education for children".

For starters, the leader of the worship service is "the Superintendent," not the pastor or one of the teachers. I suspect that would roughly map onto the Chair of the Education Committee for us. The Superintendent leads these children in a confession of sins, singing the Gloria, praying the prayers, and reading the scripture. Thankfully, he or she (this is 1928, so let's be honest – he) does not have to give a sermon. Instead, the place that occupies the sermon is marked, "Class Instruction shall begin".

This follows from a long history of Lutheran Christian Education, where teaching both adults and children about scripture is seen as a part of the Ministry of the Word: To teach about God is to preach. This is a powerful statement about both the need and the importance of education.

As we make plans for our Sunday School program this year, I would ask you to remember that preaching is not just the domain of the pastor. Our understanding of the priesthood of all believers means that you (yes, you) know something about God and God's connection to you. As you share that experience, as you interpret scripture in the light of that experience, you are preaching – and teaching.

So I would like you to take a moment and think about how you might help teach – how you might be a part of the Christian Education of Covenant. There are many opportunities and many ways to share your talents and knowledge, from the littlest in our congregation to the eldest. I hope to see you at our Education Committee meeting on August 6th. We have much to do together, and much to share.
