Over the last month, some of you may have read the bulletin or the newsletter, come to Sunday evening, and wondered, "What is 'taizé', and why is there a service about it?"

First, Taizé is a town in Burgundy, France. About 70 years ago, a Swiss protestant man who has become known as "Brother Roger" lived there, and, partly due to his tuberculosis, felt himself drawn to monastic life.

He founded a semi-monastic community in Taizé, where those that joined lived in intentional community, in simplicity. In the 60s, the community became a site of youth pilgrimage – and it still is, in many ways – with young people coming on retreat from all over Europe, and eventually coming from around the world.

This brought new problems, though: how does a group of people worship together when no one speaks the same language? By setting the rhythms of their day similarly to monastic orders, they worshiped a lot, several times a day, and so it was a real problem.

The solution was found to be in embracing the differences. By writing simple songs, just a few lines which could be easily translated, easily learned, and easily sung, they formed a new way to worship together. They sing in many languages, but in one voice. It continues to this day, with over 100,000 people visiting the community each year.

Our own service is actually more based on their "morning prayer" service, even as we hold it in the evening. It is at the beginning of the week, though, and so it fits a similar purpose: to provide a grounding in scripture and community for the busy and sometimes hectic time ahead. Between the song, scripture, and silence, I certainly found it a very useful tool for combating the busyness of Advent and Christmas.

I hope you will join us to see if it helps to center and prepare you for your week as well.

#### Call to Order:

Additions to Agenda: Need to form budget and audit committees, Men of Covenant to purchase kids gift bags, Jack Hudson's fish farm suggestion. Council decided to hear Jack's fish farm proposal at this time. Jack recommended that council use the \$210.00 raised at the used book sale to purchase a fish farm. He pointed out all of the good things that can come from providing a fish farm for a community. He also pointed out that since we were \$40 short of the \$250 needed to buy a farm, if council would approve the use of the \$210, he would like to donate \$20 from his tooth fairy money and get his grandma to match his donation to make the \$250 total. Reno moved and Red 2<sup>nd</sup> to use the \$210 raised by the sale of used books, and the donations of Jack and Christy to buy a fish farm. Motion carried.

Thrift Store: The Thrift Store had receipts of \$7,690.88. Gave assistance in the amount of \$2446.03. Spent \$129.00 in fuel costs for trips to Cheyenne. And had \$1144.88 in maintenance cost for the van, \$344.88 for license plates, and \$800.00 in shipping costs to have the new handicap van shipped to Wheatland. Ending checking account balance of \$2614.45 and a saving account balance of \$11,402.46. Grandma Attic had receipts of \$1,380.18 and an ending checking account balance of \$6,294.70.

The paperwork for the new handicap van is all ready, and just needs to be signed by Thad.
