One of the tools we use in the church is called The Revised Common Lectionary. It is revised because there was a "Common Lectionary" published about ten years before and this is a revision of it. It is Common because it is in use by a fairly large number of Protestant churches, including us, the Episcopalian Church, the Presbyterian Church, and the Methodist Church. A Lectionary is a series of assigned texts to be read on Sundays. This is important, since it means that I don't always get to choose my scriptural texts for a Sunday. It keeps me honest – not just picking my favorite dozen texts over and over, not simply skipping parts of the bible that I might rather avoid. To follow a Lectionary is a discipline in preaching.

The RCL is built on a three year cycle, around the main Gospel to be read that year. This is year A, so most of the gospel texts assigned to read are in Matthew. B will be Mark, C will be Luke. John fits in at appropriate places throughout the year (Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Vigil of Easter are all read from John, while Easter Sunday is read from Matthew, Mark, or Luke). There are a few exceptions – Christmas Eve is always read from Luke, since he tells the story so closely and intimately.

There are also Old Testament readings, Psalms, and New Testament readings assigned for each week. Well, really, there are two Old Testament Readings, and two Psalms (The psalm we sing or say is a congregational response to the Old Testament reading). As followers of Christ, we put our focus on the stories of his life, death, and resurrection – the Gospel is read each Sunday – and the usual Old Testament option has been what's called "Complementary". It matches up with the gospel, to build up the theme established by the story of Jesus. We have used the Complementary Option for the last three years.

As we are in Year A again, and finished with this year's celebrations of Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, and Easter (which usually don't have these options), I've opted to switch to the other Old Testament/Psalms selection. It's called the Semi-Continuous reading, and its goal is to more fully tell some Old Testament stories. This means that the story of Jacob wrestling overnight at the river Jabbok will come after the story of Jacob and Esau's birth and after the story of Jacob marrying Leah and Rachel. In the Complementary Series, Jacob wrestling is coupled with Jesus' parable about "Praying always and never losing heart". Both of these are good, but I hope that this may give us a new perspective on some of these familiar stories.

CONSTITUTIONAL REVISIONS

Attached to this newsletter are the revisions to the congregation's constitution suggested by the Constitution and Bylaws Revision Committee (first 9 pages), and by Pastor Joshua (page 10). They have been recommended for consideration by the congregation for a special meeting and vote on July 27th, following the service.

In the file, words that are not struckthrough or underlined remain from the previous constitution, words that are struckthrough are removed, and words that are underlined are added.

There are (broadly) three things in the proposal: Updating language to be more clear, especially with respect to electronic communications; changing the method and schedule on which the education committee chair is selected; and my proposal on communion age.

The hope is that, in sending them out as early as possible, we can talk about them (particularly my proposed change to they bylaws) together as a community, with some time for deliberation and discussion before the special meeting itself.

I look forward to discussing the possibility of these changes with you. Please come in to the office, call me, or simply come talk with me on Sunday morning about what you think.
