Throughout the church year, there are minor festivals and commemorations of important people in the history of the church. You can actually find a list on pages 15-17 in the red hymnal (ELW).

This month, on June 24th (six months before Christmas), we celebrate the birth of John the Baptist (Gabriel mentions in Luke 1 that Elizabeth is about six months pregnant at the annunciation). Putting it on June 24th makes it at about midsummer, so celebrations have often retained some of the solstice celebration in them.

While parties involving water (streams, lakes, rivers) and jumping into them to retrieve some sign of the festivity are common, and do have some connection with John's legacy of baptism, the celebration is far more often around a bonfire. Pre-Christian traditions often place bonfires at both midsummer and midwinter, as a sort of sympathetic magic. As the Christian world took over, the midsummer bonfire was combined with the celebration of John the Baptist's birth. So a story arose where Elizabeth used a signal fire to tell her relative Mary that her baby was born.

I would encourage you to look up the list of festivals and commemorations – there are a number of interesting stories and people within them. Stories of faith, and faithful people, stories of people who have lost their lives for their faith, and people who have lived their lives in faith.

Happy John the Baptist day.

Reports:

President: Thanks to the men's group for Easter morning breakfast, and to all who helped stuff and hide eggs for the kids. Wyo. Community gas was selected as our gas provider; we are on a 2yr fixed rate plan. Things are still very busy around the church.

Trustees: Spring has sprung, mowing has begun and the sprinklers have been fixed. Terry has declared war on dandelions.

Elders: Things are going well. Rich reported on the Rocky Mountain Synod Assembly, they got to visit the new office of the Synod Bishop. He reported on some plans to make our District greener, including webinars', solar panels and better insulation at the district office and new churches. Also planning on sharing keynote speeches from this Assembly and prior Assembly's via video at the adult Sunday school class.

#### Committee Reports:

Youth: No report

Stewardship: No formal meeting this month.

Worship: Praise in the park will be mid July, we are in summer mode.

Women of ELCA: Nothing going on.

Hospitality: Graduation celebration set for Sunday, preparing for 3 upcoming Baptisms.

Men of Covenant: Donated \$200.00 for plants for the landscaping, bought flowers for the ladies on Mother's Day. Donations from the Easter morning breakfast came close to breaking even with the cost of the meal.

Outreach: Still delivering CD's.

Altar Guild: A wine carafe is breaking will need to replaced. Will be returning to Mogen David for communion wine, three buck chuck was not a big favorite.

Landscape: Jim thanked the men's group for their donation of \$200.00 for plants and also mentioned that he had secured \$250.00 a Thrivent Action Team grant. That left us \$250.00 short of the estimated cost of \$700.00 for the plants. Dorothy moved and Rich 2<sup>nd</sup> that the remaining funds be paid by the church out of the memorial funds account. Motion carried. A planting day is scheduled for 5/21 to be followed by a potluck dinner.

<u>Old Business</u>: Melissa and Beth reported that the community/pallet garden project is ongoing however at this point it won't happen till next year.

The Constitution Revision committee handed its recommendations to council. The council got the revisions and copies of the current constitution, Jim moved and Christy 2<sup>nd</sup>, to table a vote to accept the revisions as written until our next meeting to allow some time to read and compare. Motion carried

<u>New Business:</u> Due to changes in state law, it has been recommended that we look into putting a Columbarium at our church. The Episcopal Church is already well into the planning stages for one at their church, so Dorothy and Christy volunteered to get with them and investigate.

It was also pointed out that our swing set is trashed and a possible hazard and should be removed. All agreed, Jim volunteered to remove it and haul to the dump after his trip to Texas.

Discussion on the snack shop was opened up, and concerns regarding liability, tax exempt status, and the use of the kitchen were talked about. It was decided that more information was needed to make a quality decision. All are invited to Grandma's Attic to look around and discuss the possibility of the snack shop.
