We'd gather for food, time together, and a good hike through the woods. In this pastor's youth, Saint John the Baptist day on June 24th was an important holiday in the Danish church, and while it's not so much in the American church, he held onto those traditions and memories he'd had and shared them with us.

The Nativity of John the baptist is traditionally held to be June 24th, not because of any evidence, but because it's 6 months before Jesus' nativity on December 24th. This is why Scandinavian churches, in particular, find so much meaning in the day – Jesus is born near the Winter solstice and John is born near the Summer solstice, important days in the far north. With the birth of Jesus we get more sun, with the birth of John we get less. This is usually connected to the words of John the Baptist in John 3, "He must increase, but I must decrease."

I suspect that you have traditions and memories that you have carried with you from your youth, and I hope that you might share them with the younger members of our congregation . I know that Pastor Ove had a lot to do with my faith formation, and our yearly Sankthans day visit was a part of that. We each have great opportunities to share the things that make us who we are, and together help form the faith of the youngest among us.
