## Connecting people to God with the message of God's love!



If you open a red hymnal to page 54, you'll come across a list of lesser festivals and commemorations. These are dates that remember an important person (or important people), but don't usually get celebrated unless they happen to be on a Sunday. The first one on the list is Saint Andrew, traditionally the first disciple of Jesus.

Unfortunately, being the first one on the list means that when November 30th is on a Sunday, it's also the first Sunday of Advent. So we don't do much for Saint Andrew, at least any more. At one point, his day was the last of a sequence of Autumn "Craft Feasts", where different craftsmen sold what they'd been working on over the summer. Andrew, as a fisherman, is related to fishermen and their tools, so ropes and nets were blessed and shown that day, along with the craftsmen themselves. Their similarities meant that women often celebrated and sold their lace workings at the feast as well. Industrialization has changed the feast a little bit, and crackdowns on public drunkenness may have had their part as well (We have records of odd folk songs that include phrases like, "On the 25th of October; cursed be the cobbler who goes to bed sober." The 25th of October is Saints Crispin and Crispinian's day, patron saints of shoemakers).

Andrew is first on the list because he is traditionally understood to be the first disciple. Luke doesn't seem to mention the first calling of disciples, but in Matthew and Mark, Jesus calls to Peter and Andrew on the seaside, telling them that they will be fishers of men. They drop their nets and come with him. John's gospel clarifies that Andrew comes to Jesus first, and the first thing he does is to go and bring his brother. This is the beginning of Jesus' ministry with others.

As we prepare to begin another church year, we might think about Andrew a little bit – how he jumped at the opportunity Jesus gave him, and how his first desire is to share what he has learned from Jesus with those close to him. We have an opportunity this Advent and Christmas to share what we have learned from Jesus, bringing others to discipleship just as Andrew did.


