
In Life Together, Dietrich Bonhoeffer suggests a pattern for the day, for a life together with others. It is centered around scripture, song, and prayer, at the points in the day when we have a meal. As we receive signs of God's love for us in Our Daily Bread, it makes sense to give thanks to the one who gives it to us. So at morning, at lunch, and at dinner, he argues, we should all come together, read from scripture, sing songs of praise, and pray together.

And then I look at my mornings, and what I know of the mornings in most of your households (especially those of you with children) look like, and suspect that it might be difficult, singing hymns together around the breakfast table. You probably don't spend lunch with the same people you ate breakfast with – or you might eat alone. Evenings may be the last, best chance for some of this Life Together.

So I have a suggestion for you, a plan for your dinner conversation. Begin by sharing the things that happened that day – the things that were good, the things that were troubling. Read a passage from the Bible together. I can give you suggestions, or you can pick from your favorite stories. Then talk together about the things that happened that day, and what the Bible might say about them. When the meal is over, pray together, and before you get up and go about the work of the evening, bless each other – give thanks to God for each other's presence in your lives.

Our lives together are a gift from God. I hope you will take some time together as you share a meal to give thanks to God for those gifts.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE

The Education Committee met at the church on Wednesday, August 6 at 7:00 PM. Eleven people attended and shared their ideas and opinions about the needs. goals, and overall direction of our educational efforts here at Covenant Lutheran. One thing that arose out of the meeting was a desire to have more of the congregation involved in

our educational efforts. As a result, the current plan is to have an intergenerational Sunday School on the first Sunday of each month. After service we will gather in the social hall and, from the youngest to the oldest, together talk about faith and the Bible. Pastor Joshua will be leading class on those days and we hope to see involvement from all ages.

On the other three or four Sundays of the month regular Sunday school classes will be held for the children. We have two groups of kids this year. Group #1 consists of the preschoolers and kindergarteners and Group #2 consists of kids in grades 1 through 4. One major change has been made to when Sunday School actually starts. Beginning on Sunday, September 14, the Sunday school children will be dismissed from service immediately following communion. Their teachers will take them to their classrooms where they will begin their lessons while the adults are finishing service. When their lessons are finished, they will return to the empty sanctuary to practice their songs and music while the adults enjoy some fellowship time. Finally, after music practice, the children will be excused to the fellowship hall to enjoy some treats.

Finally, we are still looking for people to volunteer as teachers, classroom helpers and substitutes for Sunday school. If you would be willing to share 30 minutes of your time, one Sunday a month, it would be greatly appreciated. Please contact Sarah Jesse or Dawn McKee to discuss what part you would like to play in educating the kids of Covenant.
